- Snappy Phone intends to provide basic local exchange and interexchange telecommunications service as a non-facility based provider and on a resale basis. This will be provided in all exchanges currently served by the incumbent local exchange telecommunications company of Sprint/United Telephone Company ("United"), and GTE Midwest, Inc. ("GTE"). Applicant currently holds authority to provide these services in all exchanges served by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company ("SWBT") issued in Case No. TA-2000-372. The specific incumbent local exchanges within which Applicant proposes to offer service are listed in the incumbent providers' respective local exchange tariffs and will specifically included in the Applicant's tariff. Pursuant to applicable law, and subject to Applicant's right under federal or state laws to seek to offer, and offer and provide service in geographical areas smaller than an exchange or in market segmentations or to offer customer specific pricing, similarly situated subscribers located within the listed exchanges will receive services on equal terms and conditions as set forth in Applicant's tariffs.
- 4. Pursuant to this application Snappy Phone seeks to offer and provide all forms of basic local telecommunications service and interexchange telecommunications services.
- 5. The Applicant possesses the technical experience and financial resources necessary to provide telecommunications service



R. Daniel (Smokev) Hvde. Jr.. CEO Mr. Hyde, 61, is a native of El Paso, Texas and a graduate of Texas A&M University. He became a resident of Louisiana in December of 1971 when he purchased KRMD AM/FM Radio in Shreveport, LA. He operated these stations for 15 years. His partner for those 15 years as Sales Manager, was the same Jerry W. Black aforementioned in this application. When the stations were sold in 1985, the sale was the largest radio transaction in the history of the state at \$5.5 million. Mr. Hyde divested himself of radio stations in Flagstaff, Arizona, Reno, Nevada and Shreveport, Louisiana, and entered the paging business in 1988 when he formed Stay in Touch. When that business was sold in 1998, it had a subscriber base of 40,000 with a total of nine (9) retail outlets where paging, prepaid cellular and prepaid home phone service were marketed. The business' system grew from three towers and transmitters to 26 towers and transmitters, serving all of Louisiana and East Texas. Since selling Stay in Touch, Mr. Hyde has devoted his full-time efforts to the development of Budget Phone, Inc. and Snappy Phone of Texas, Inc.

President & General Manager. Mr. Black, 61, is a native of El Paso, Jerry W. Black. Texas and attended Tarleton State University in Stephenville, Texas. He became a resident of Louisiana in December of 1971 when he and Mr. Hyde purchased KRMD Radio in Shreveport. In addition to Snappy Phone, Mr. Black is now the Retail Manager for Budget Phone's two successful retail stores in Longview and Tyler.

He has worked in the computer industry since 1968 and started his own consulting company in 1977. He served as CEO of Digital Electronics for 15 years. Since that time he has worked as an independent consultant throughout North America specializing in networks.






