Response of Atmos Energy Corporation to Staff Recommendation

COMES NOW Atmos Energy Corporation, through its United Cities Gas Company Division, (Atmos) and pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.080 respectfully files its Response to the Staff Recommendation filed on August 1, 2000. In support of this response, Atmos states as follows:

- 1. On October 26, 2000, Senior Regulatory Law Judge Bill Hopkins issued an Order Granting Application to Intervene and Order Directing Filing. In this Order, Atmos was directed to file by November 27, 2000, its response to the Staff's recommendation for peak day analysis included in its August 1, 2000 Recommendation filed in this proceeding. In the Staff's recommendation, Staff recommended, *inter alia*, that Associated Natural Gas Company (ANG) "continue to (1) provide an estimation of the peak day demand and annual demand for each of the five districts/pipeline service areas with each year's ACA submittal, (2) review and update Company assumptions made to estimate the peak and annual demand, (3) provide an explanation of how the capacity will meet this demand and (4) include the following information:
 - a. For the Integrated system, include a discussion of how capacity would meet the demand of a peak day occurrence in February when the TETCO Storage volume may be at a reduced inventory level.

- b. For each of the five ANG districts/pipeline service areas, (1) submit, with the 1999/2000 ACA filing, a comparison of actual sendout and heating degrees days for two or more recent peak days to the estimated demand for those conditions (heating degreed days and number of customers) and (2) provide an explanation when the model does not reasonably agree with the actual load encountered.
- c. For each of the five ANG districts/pipeline service areas, estimate, and submit with the 1999/2000 ACA filing, the reserve margin for the 1999/2000 ACA period and for three to five years beyond that."

Staff Recommendation, pp. 4-5.

2. Since Atmos, through its United Cities Gas Company division, is currently operating the service area formerly operated by ANG, it would be logical for Atmos to address any reporting requirements related to the former ANG properties. Upon review of the Staff Recommendation, Atmos has determined that it is appropriate and reasonable for it to provide the peak day analysis and related information requested by Staff. Atmos will agree to perform the analysis requested by the Commission Staff to be filed with it next scheduled filing for the 1999/2000 ACA period, as requested by Staff.

WHEREFORE, Atmos Energy Corporation, through its United Cities Gas Company Division, having responded to the Order Granting Application to Intervene and Order Directing Filing, and the Staff Recommendation filed on August 1, 2000, requests that the Commission consider its Response and its agreement to conduct the peak day analysis as requested by the Staff.
