ORDER DIRECTING FILING

On February 23, 1996, the Commission adopted the recommendations of the Staff of the Commission relating to Kansas City Power & Light Company's 1995 LaCygne Unit #1 AQC fire. To determine status compliance with the Commission's order, on June 25, 1998, the Commission issued an Order Directing Case Status Report by December 31, 1998.

On December 31, 1998, Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL) filed a status report with the Commission as directed. Among other notes of compliance in its status report, KCPL indicated that operator training on the Iatan simulator was expected to proceed at the LaCygne Unit #1 simulator from approximately mid-April to the end of November 1999. Completion of the operator training on the Iatan simulators at LaCygne Unit #1 would complete the last recommendations of Staff related to the 1995 LaCygne Unit #1 AQC fire.

To determine the completion of KCPL's compliance with the Commission's order issued February 23, 1996, as reported in its December 31, 1998 filing, the Commission will direct KCPL to file a

compliance status report indicating its compliance with the Commission's February 23, 1996 order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Kansas City Power & Light Company shall file a case status report regarding its compliance with the Commission's order issued February 23, 1996 no later than 4 p.m. on April 18, 2000.
 - 2. That this order shall become effective on April 10, 2000.
