Purpose of Filing: Voluntary Tax Reform Act Reduction of \$1,500,118

On December 7, 1987, The Kansas Power and Light Company (KPL Gas Service) of Topeka, Kansas, voluntarily filed tariffs to further reduce rates in its sales and transportation service schedules to reflect their anticipated reduced federal tax liabilities due to the Tax Reform Act of 1986 (TRA). When combined with their March 9, 1987, voluntary TRA reduction, KPL Gas Service's rates will be reduced to reflect a cumulative total of \$2,029,164.

The Missouri Public Service Commission Staff has performed an audit and investigation of KPL Gas Service and is of the opinion that the total amount related to the TRA, as represented by the March and December, 1987, filings, is a reasonably true reflection of its reduced tax liabilities in the State of Missouri (copy of Accounting Staff's memo attached).

This filing, as did the March, 1987, filing, proposes to reduce rates through the application of a uniform dollar per Mcf decrease. Staff has reviewed this proposed method of allocating the reduction and believes it to be a reasonable method in this case (copy of Research and Planning's memo attached).
