MAWC RESPONSE TO STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW Missouri-American Water Company (MAWC) and, in response to Staff's Recommendation for Opening a Working Docket, states as follows to the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission):

- 1. On November 9, 2012, MAWC filed a petition asking the Commission to promulgate a rule to implement an environmental cost adjustment mechanism for the water industry. Thereafter, taking into account Section 536.041, RSMo,¹ and Rule 4 CSR 240-2.180², the Commission directed Staff to investigate and recommend whether the Commission should proceed with a rulemaking.
- 2. On December 14, 2012, Staff filed a pleading entitled "Staff's Recommendation for Opening a Working Docket" (Staff's Recommendation). Therein, among other things, the Staff recommended that the Commission "proceed with the rulemaking process by opening a working docket to facilitate the process." Staff further suggests that workshops be held on January 24, 2013, and February 28, 2013, for this purpose.

Within sixty days after the receipt of the petition, the agency shall submit a written response to the petitioner and copies of the response, in electronic format, to the joint committee on administrative rules and to the commissioner of administration, containing its determination whether such rule should be adopted, continued without change, amended, or rescinded, together with a concise summary of the state agency's specific facts and findings with respect to the criteria set forth in subsection 4 of section 536.175. If the agency determines the rule merits adoption, amendment, or rescission, it shall initiate proceedings in accordance with the applicable requirements of this chapter. . . . "
