Each applicant has also requested competitive classification.

The Commission must find that the grant of service authority is in the public interest. § 392.440. Applications for authority to provide basic local services must comply with § 392.455. The Commission may classify a company as competitive if it finds that all the telecommunications services the company offers are competitive services. § 392.361.3. The Commission ordinarily waives the application of the statutes and Commission rules listed below for competitive companies.
