8 9 10 11		A. Yes. If the Stipulation is approved by the Commission, the only issue remaining to be decided in File No. ER-2018-0228 would be the design of the rate structure to flow back the annual tax savings to customers.	
12	A.	Staff recommends that the terms of the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and	
13	Agreement (NUSA) specific to Tax Cuts and Jobs Act ("TCJA") matters that was filed or		
14	April 24, 2018 in Case Nos. EO-2018-0092 and ER-2018-0228 be found to be reasonable for		
15	ratemaking purposes even though the NUSA was not adopted by the Commission as a whole		
16	and that those TCJA terms should be ordered in this case as explained in the testimony of		
17	Staff witness Mark Oligschlaeger. As for the outstanding issues regarding rate design, Staff		
8	notes that the Commission issued an order on July 5, 2018, in File No. ER-2018-0362

c. The tariff sheets for each of the above service classifications will be updated to include reference to the cents per kilowatt-hour rates and resulting credits derived in the prior step.... No other charges or other terms or conditions of service that are currently stated on those sheets will be modified.

For ease of administration and consistency with the Ameren Missouri approach, Staff recommends that a similar design be employed for Empire. If Empire's billing system cannot easily accommodate printing a separate line item on the customers' bills, Staff does not object to Empire consolidating the value of the credit into a net energy charge or a net bill; however, Staff recommends that the existing tariffed energy rates be maintained.

#### Sarah L.K. Lange

I received my J.D. from the University of Missouri, Columbia, in 2007, and am licensed to practice law in the State of Missouri. I received my B.S. in Historic Preservation from Southeast Missouri State University, and took courses in architecture at Drury University. Since beginning my employment with the MoPSC I have taken courses in economics through Columbia College and courses in energy transmission through Bismarck State College, and have attended various trainings and seminars.

I began my employment with the Commission in May 2006 as an intern in what was then known as the General Counsel's Office. I was hired as a Legal Counsel in September 2007, and was promoted to Associate Counsel in 2009, and Senior Counsel in 2011. During that time my duties consisted of leading major rate case litigation and settlement, and presenting Staff's position to the Commission, and providing legal advice and assistance primarily in the areas of depreciation, cost of service, class cost of service, rate design, tariff issues, resource planning, accounting authority orders, construction audits, rulemakings and workshops, fuel adjustment clauses, document management and retention, and customer complaints.
