STAFF RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW the Staff ("Staff") of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") in the above-captioned matter and for its recommendation states as follows:

- 1. On September 17, 2000, Southern Missouri Gas Company, L.P. (Company) filed a "Request For Variance From Tariff Provisions" and a tariff sheet with a proposed effective date of October 1, 2001. The Company filed the tariff to reflect unscheduled changes in the Company's Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) due to changes in the cost of natural gas for the remaining summer season. The Company also seeks a one-time waiver from the PGA Clause due to recent reductions in natural gas prices since its scheduled summer filing.
- 2. Staff has reviewed the Application, and recommends that the one-time Variance Request be granted. Staff has reviewed the PGA filing and has determined, with the exception of the one-time Variance Request to file an unscheduled summer PGA changing the UFA, PGA and ACA factors, that this filing was calculated in accordance with the Company's approved PGA clause. The recommendation of the Gas Department Tariffs/Rate Design Staff is attached



as Attachment A hereto. Staff also recommends that the rates be interim, subject to refund. Staff further recommends that good cause for approval on less than thirty days notice has been demonstrated.

WHEREFORE, the Staff recommends that the Commission approve the proposed tariff sheet and Variance, interim, subject to refund.

SUBJECT: Staff Recommendation For Southern Missouri Gas Company, L.P.'s

Request for a One-Time Variance and an Unscheduled Summer Season

Filing Effective October 1, 2001.

DATE: September 26, 2001

On September 17, 2001, Southern Missouri Gas Company, L.P. (SMGC or Company) of Mountain Grove, Missouri, filed a tariff sheet with a proposed effective date of October 1, 2001 and a REQUEST FOR VARIANCE FROM TARIFF PROVISIONS (Variance). The tariff sheet was filed to reflect unscheduled changes in SMGC's Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) factors as the result of changes in the cost of natural gas for the remaining summer season. The summer season includes the months of April through October. In addition, this tariff filing reflects the termination of the Unscheduled Filing Adjustment Factor (UFA) and a change to the Actual Cost Adjustment (ACA) factor. The Variance was filed to allow the Company to file an unscheduled summer PGA to reflect these changes.

The Variance filed in conjunction with the unscheduled filing requests a onetime waiver from the PGA Clause of SMGC's tariffs due to recent reductions in the market price of natural gas since its scheduled summer filing. In addition, SMGC cites the following two reasons for approval of this one-time waiver:

 To provide a more accurate price signal to consumers regarding the current cost of natural gas; and

2.) To help keep the DCCB and the ACA balances at appropriate levels and not create over-collections or under-collections that would need to be reflected in future periods.

The net effect of these changes will decrease the PGA factor to \$0.7160 per hundred cubic feet (Ccf) from the current PGA factor of \$0.8989 per Ccf. The firm PGA factor would decrease 20% under this proposal. This proposal would decrease a typical residential customer's bill by 2% when comparing the summer season with the rates that are currently in effect. SMGC does not anticipate a PGA change in its scheduled winter filing in October, 2001.

Case No. GR-2001-388, under which this change was filed, was established to track the Company's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 2000-2001 ACA filing. Additionally, Case No. GR-2001-39 was established to track SMGC's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 1999-2000 ACA filing. Interim subject to refund status should be maintained pending final Commission decisions in Case Nos. GR-2001-39 and GR-2001-388.

The Commission's Energy Department - Tariffs/Rate Design Staff (Staff) has reviewed the Variance and agrees that the one-time Variance request be granted. Staff has also reviewed the PGA filing and has determined that, with the exception of the one-time Variance request to file an unscheduled summer PGA changing the UFA, PGA, and ACA factors, this filing was calculated in accordance with SMGC's PGA Clause. Staff is of the opinion that good cause for approval of this tariff sheet on less than thirty days notice is demonstrated by SMGC's Commission-approved PGA clause allowing for ten (10) business days notice for PGA change filings. Therefore, Staff recommends that the Commission grant the approval of the following tariff sheet and Variance, interim subject to refund:

REMARKS

For a typical residential customer using approximately 312 Ccf's during the summer season (April October), natural gas rates will decrease by \$7.68 or approximately 2% when comparing the fuel bills for the current summer season before and after the unscheduled summer filing.

- (1) Total fuel bill does not include gross receipts or local sales taxes.
- (2) Monthly usage priced at the rates in effect during the appropriate time period.
