MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME FOR FILING OF POSTHEARING BRIEFS

COME NOW KCP&L – Greater Missouri Operations ("GMO"), the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, the Office of the Public Counsel, AG Processing, Inc. a cooperative, the Sedalia Industrial Energy Users' Association, and Dogwood Energy LLC (collectively "Signatories") and for their Motion for Extension of Time for Filing of Posthearing Briefs respectfully state as follows:

1. On August 18, 2010, the Commission issued its Order establishing a procedural schedule in this docket. That order scheduled Posthearing Briefs in this matter to be filed on March 10, 2011. In addition, that Order approved a stipulation by which GMO would extend the effective date of the underlying tariffs until June 4, 2011 (Ordered Paragraph 2).

2. On February 18, 2011, the main evidentiary hearing in this matter was completed with the true-up hearing scheduled to be finished on March 4, 2011. As such, approximately 3 months still remain until the new tariff effective date.

3. Recognizing the extension of the tariff effective date as to the GMO tariffs, the Signatories request that they be granted an extension for the filing of their Posthearing Briefs in this matter. Specifically, the Signatories request that they be allowed to file their Initial Posthearing Briefs on the GMO-only issues on March 25,

2011 with the Reply Briefs due on April 4, 2011. This extension will not affect the filing of briefs regarding the KCPL-only issues and the KCPL and GMO common issues. As such, the requested extension would only affect the following issues:

- a) Iatan Allocation to L&P and MPS;
- b) All Crossroad Issues;
- c) All FAC Issues (including sharing and rebasing); and
- d) Jeffrey Energy Center FGD Project.

4. This extension should not inhibit the Commission in its deliberations, since the vast majority of the issues will be briefed as either KCPL or common issues. Furthermore, this extension should allow for better developed briefs for the Commission's consideration on the GMO only issues.

5. Signatories have discussed this matter with counsel for the remaining parties and have not been informed of any party having an objection to this request.
