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The initial rate of \$22.53 remained from Nov. 1994 until Nov. 2006 when it was adjusted to \$27.75. The rate was again increased in Nov. 2008 to \$44.79 and the PSC staff and the company have agreed on another increase to \$53.22. In just over 3 years this would be a 136% increase while the Consumer Price Index (CPI) shows approximately a 7% increase. If the sewer rate had increased since inception at the CPI increase of 45%, the current rate, based off the original rate of \$22.53 would be \$32.67. And since the CPI has actually declined since the last rate increase in Nov. 2008, how can any increase, not to mention the agreed upon 19% increase, be granted? And why was the 61% increase granted in Nov. 2008 warranted when the CPI increase was 7.3%? The 61% increase followed a 23% increase just 2 years earlier.

It's also interesting to note the varying rates paid by Aqua Missouri customers. For example, in the Sept. 29, 2006 PSC News release, the current rate paid by Jefferson City was \$22.53 and the

I am a homeowner and resident of Quail Valley Lake Subdivision and wish to file a comment regarding Aqua Missouri request for rate increase. Before I purchased a lot in Quail Valley Lake Subdivision to build my house I read the covenants and visited with long-term residents to be assured this was a community that included the services I desired. I was shown documentation that money from the original sale of each lot was escrowed to pay for the sewage treatment system in place. That treatment system was granted to Capital Utilities to operate and to maintain. Each homeowner must purchase and maintain a septic tank that hooks into the sewage treatment system.

Through my years in Quail Valley Lake Subdivision the sewage treatment system has changed ownership from Capital Utilities to Aqua Source and now to Aqua America, Inc. 1 have experienced two rate increases since moving into my house at 2825 Foxdale Drive in November 1999. My monthly sewage treatment billing was initially \$22.53 in 1999 and that rate remained constant through November 2006 when it was adjusted up to \$27.75. That rate was increased just two years later in November 2008 to \$44.75. Now, in 2010 my sewage treatment rate is increasing again to \$53.22 per month. I believed the percentage increase granted in November 2008 was unjustified however I did not take. However, in less than two years yet another increase has been requested. I disapprove and ask the Missouri Public Service Commission to reexamine Aqua Source, Inc. rate increase.

The economic situation is tough enough in this capital city area. Wages have remained relatively constant for more than two years and have increased little during the last five. Please review Aqua Source, Inc. profits and reconsider their rate increase request for Quail Valley Lake Subdivision residents.

And why was the 61% increase granted in Nov. 2008 warranted when the CPI increase was 7.3%? The 61% increase followed a 23% increase just 2 years earlier.

There was evidently a document filed with the Public Service Commission in 1992 with an effective date of May 27, 1992 that provides a schedule of service charges stating "A charge of \$65 per load will be assessed each Customer that the Company is required to remove solids from the Customer's septic tank." In the 17 years I have lived in my home the Company has never pumped my septic. I have had it pumped but it cost more than the \$65 that the Company agreed to charge. Is it true that the Company, along with the rate increase, is requesting that they be relieved of the responsibility of removing solids from the customer's tanks? If so, customers will be paying more than \$65 so this also is, in effect, a rate increase.

Aqua America, Inc. reports strong sales and profit from 2007 to 2008 with a 3% profit increase. In their annual report they discuss how they controlled operation and maintenance expenses despite the high fuel cost in 2008. Aqua America has gradually increased dividends from 2006 through 2009 from \$0.44 to \$0.55 and declared a first quarter dividend for 2010 of \$0.145 or \$0.58 annualized.

In these difficult economic times when the CPI is unchanged and people on social security did not receive an increase in benefits from 2009 to 2010, yet Aqua's sales, profits and dividends are on the rise, how can the increase in sewer rates be justified?

On behalf of my neighbors in Quail Valley I ask the Commission to consider these issues when reviewing the Company's request.
