

ORDER GRANTING APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE
AND SETTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Timely applications to intervene in the above-referenced case have been
filed by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Competitive Telecommunications
Association of Missouri, the Missouri Hotel and Motel Association and the Midwest
Independent Coin Payphone Association.

Since no opposition has been voiced to these applications, the Commission
determines they should be granted.

On June 8, 1988, the Office of the Public Counsel (Public Counsel) filed a
motion to establish a procedural schedule in this case. Public Counsel states that
no present party to this case opposes its proposed schedule.

The Commission determines that Public Counsel's procedural schedule is
reasonable and should be adopted.

ORDERED: 1. That the applications to intervene of Southwestern Bell

Association are granted hereby.


ORDERED: 2. That the following procedural schedule is established hereby
