

the Wolf Creek Generating Station Decommissioning Cost Update. KCPL stated that it had recently discovered that it had made an error in this study. KCPL stated that the parties cannot reach a stipulation and agreement until the error is corrected and thus requests an extension of time to correct the error. KCPL stated that all parties agreed with the request.

Because of the complex nature of the case, the Commission will extend the deadline beyond the time requested by KCPL.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the motion of Kansas City Power & Light Company for an extension of time to file a procedural schedule is granted.
2. That the parties shall file a procedural schedule no later than 3:00 PM on January 4, 2000.
3. That the procedural schedule shall include dates for the filing of testimony and for an evidentiary hearing.
4. That this order shall become effective on November 23, 1999.


