## ORDER REQUIRING FILING

On June 8 2000, Payroll Advance, Inc. (Payroll) filed an Application with the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) for the approval of an interconnection agreement (the agreement) with Illinois Bell Telephone Company, Indiana Bell Telephone Company Incorporated, Michigan Bell Telephone Company, Nevada Bell Telephone Company, The Ohio Bell Telephone Company, Pacific Bell Telephone Company, The Southern New England Telephone Company, Wisconsin Bell, Inc. d/b/a Ameritech Wisconsin (collectively known as Southwestern Bell Telephone Company or SWBT).

Payroll stated that it was an Arkansas corporation operating in Missouri under a certificate of service authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services granted to it on January 4, 2000, in case number TA-99-405. Payroll stated that it proposed to offer those telecommunications services pursuant to the resale agreement it attached to its application.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(3) states, in part: "Each pleading shall include a . . . specific reference to the statutory provision or other authority under which relief is requested." Payroll's petition did not comply with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(3) in that it did not include a specific reference to the statutory provision or other authority under which relief was requested.

Payroll will be ordered to file a supplemental pleading correcting this deficiency.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Payroll Advance, Inc. shall file, no later than 3:00 p.m. on July 5, 2000, a supplemental pleading which includes a specific reference to the statutory provision or other authority under which it requested relief.
  - 2. That this order shall become effective on June 26, 2000.
