ORDER DENYING APPLICATIONS FOR REHEARING

On May 2, 2000, the Commission issued a Report and Order that approved a tariff filed by AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc., designed to implement a new optional calling plan known as the Overlay Plan. On May 11, 2000, Alma Telephone Company, Chariton Valley Telephone Corporation, Choctaw Telephone Company, Mid-Missouri Telephone Company, Modern Telecommunications Company, MoKan Dial, Inc., and Northeast Missouri Rural Telephone Company filed an application for rehearing. On May 22, 2000, the Small Telephone Company Group<sup>1</sup> filed an application for rehearing. Also on May 22, 2000, the Office of the Public Counsel filed

a motion for rehearing. All of these applications re-argue the essential position taken by these parties.

Pursuant to Section 386.500, RSMo 1994, the Commission shall grant a rehearing if in its judgment there is sufficient reason to do so. The parties seeking rehearing have not provided sufficient reason for the Commission to grant a rehearing, and the Commission will deny their applications.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That the application for rehearing filed by Alma Telephone Company, Chariton Valley Telephone Corporation, Choctaw Telephone Company, Mid-Missouri Telephone Company, Modern Telecommunications Company, MoKan Dial, Inc., and Northeast Missouri Rural Telephone Company on May 11, 2000, is denied.

2. That the application for rehearing filed by the Small Telephone Company Group on May 22, 2000, is denied.

3. That the application for rehearing filed by the Office of the Public Counsel on May 22, 2000, is denied.

4. That this order shall become effective on June 20, 2000.
