ORDER APPROVING REORGANIZATION

On October 15, 1999, NorthPoint Communications, Inc. (NorthPoint), and NorthPoint Communications Holdings, Inc., by their counsel filed an application "pursuant to § 392.300 RSMo," to request approval of a corporate reorganization to establish NorthPoint as a wholly owned subsidiary of NorthPoint Holdings, Inc. On November 15, 1999, a Motion to Correct Application was filed stating that the holding company name was not correctly stated; that NorthPoint Communications Holdings, Inc., was an erroneous name; and that the correct name should be NorthPoint Communications Group, Inc. (NorthPoint Group).

According to the application, NorthPoint will continue as the certificate holder operating as a telecommunications company in Missouri. However, NorthPoint will be a wholly owned subsidiary of NorthPoint Group. NorthPoint Group is a new company owned by the present owners of NorthPoint. The applicants stated that the reorganization will assist in attracting financing, reducing operating expenses and realizing operational and management efficiencies. The applicants further state that the

reorganization would have no apparent effect on customers, will result in no change in officers and directors and will have no impact on the tax revenues of any political subdivision in Missouri.

The application also presented that the reorganization had already occurred and that the applicants subsequently learned that Commission approval was required for the transaction. The applicants requested the Commission's approval on a nunc pro tunc basis.

The Commission's Staff filed its recommendation on November 26, 1999. The recommendation confirmed the representations of the applicants. The Staff further informed that Commission that NorthPoint received its Missouri certificate to provide interexchange and non-switched local exchange telecommunications services in Case No. TA-98-533, in an order issued June 30, 1998. Staff indicated that NorthPoint Group was a Delaware corporation and that the reorganization consisted of the shareholders of NorthPoint exchanging their shares of stock on a one-for-one basis for shares in NorthPoint Group. The Staff recommended that the Commission grant prospective approval of the internal corporate reorganization presented in the application.

Section 392.340.1, RSMo 1994, provides that the reorganization of telecommunications companies is subject to the supervision and control of the Commission and that no reorganization may occur without the Commission's authorization. Section 392.300.1, RSMo 1994, provides, in part, that a sale or merger of the facilities of a telecommunications company, by any means direct or indirect, must likewise be authorized by the Commission.

The Commission has reviewed the application and Staff's recommendation and finds that the proposed merger and reorganization plan will have no adverse impact on the Missouri customers of NorthPoint. The Commission finds that the transaction is not detrimental to the public interest and should be approved prospectively.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the application by NorthPoint Communications, Inc., to merge and reorganize NorthPoint Communications, Inc., into NorthPoint Communications Group, Inc., by way of a stock acquisition is approved prospectively from the effective date of this order.
 - 2. That this order shall become effective on December 7, 1999.
 - 3. That this case may be closed on December 20, 1999.
