ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

On March 17, 2000, Missouri Gas Energy, a division of Southern Union Company (MGE), filed a revised tariff designed to extend collection of the Experimental Price Stabilization Charge (EPSC) until the effective date of its scheduled winter Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) filing. MGE requested expedited consideration with approval on or before April 1, 2000. Additionally, MGE stated, continuation of the EPSC will help to balance cost recovery with the associated expenditures. MGE states that these two points, together with the interrelationship between this tariff filing and its scheduled summer PGA filing expected to become effective April 1, 2000, constitute good cause for approval with less than thirty days' notice.

On March 23, 2000, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed its memorandum in which it recommends that the Commission approve MGE's proposed tariff effective April 1, 2000. Staff states that continuing collection of the EPSC through the summer will help lessen the

possible impact the EPSC will have on next year's Actual Cost Adjustment factor.

The Commission has reviewed the tariff filing and the Staff memorandum, and has determined that extending the EPSC is in the public interest. The Commission finds that good cause exists to approve the tariff on less than thirty days' notice.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Tariff No. 200000849, filed March 17, 2000, by i Missouri Gas Energy, a division of Southern Union Company, consisting of the following tariff sheets is hereby approved for service on or after April 1, 2000:
