**ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE AND NONSWITCHED  
LOCAL EXCHANGE CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE AUTHORITY  
AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF**

Adelphia Telecommunications, Inc. (Adelphia), applied to the Public Service Commission on January 4, 2000, for certificates of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.410-.450, RSMo 1994, and RSMo Supp. 1999.<sup>1</sup> Adelphia asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and to waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. Adelphia is a Delaware corporation with its principal office located at Main at Water Street, Coudersport, Pennsylvania 16913.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications for Intrastate Certificates of Service Authority and Opportunity to Intervene on January 11, 2000, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by January 26, 2000. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party

has requested the opportunity to present evidence. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked permission to intervene or requested a hearing, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the verified application.

Adelphia filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on February 10, 2000, and March 6, 2000. The tariff's effective date is March 21, 2000, extended from February 18, 2000, February 29, 2000, and March 7, 2000. Adelphia's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies Adelphia as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. Adelphia intends to provide inter-exchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services including 1+, 800/888/877 Services, Private Line, Debit Card, and Travel Card services.

In its memorandum filed on March 10, 2000, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) recommended that the Commission grant Adelphia a certificate of interexchange service authority, and a certificate of service authority for local exchange telecommunication services on condition that this authority be restricted to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services. Staff recommended that the Commission grant Adelphia competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that

the Commission approve the proposed tariff as amended to become effective on March 21, 2000.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications markets is in the public interest and Adelphia should be granted certificates of service authority. The Commission finds that the services Adelphia proposes to offer are competitive and Adelphia should be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that Adelphia's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on January 4, 2000, shall be approved as amended to become effective on March 21, 2000.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That Adelphia Telecommunications, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to the conditions of certification set out above.

2. That Adelphia Telecommunications, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri limited to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.

3. That Adelphia Telecommunications, Inc., is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
