ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE AND NONSWITCHED LOCAL EXCHANGE CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

essential.com, Inc. (essential), applied to the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) on April 6, 2000, for certificates of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.410-.450, RSMo 1994, and RSMo Supp. 1999. essential asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. essential is a Delaware corporation with its principal office located at 3 Burlington Woods Drive, 4th Floor, Burlington, Massachusetts 01803.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications for Intrastate Certificates of Service Authority and Opportunity to Intervene on April 18, 2000, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by May 3, 2000. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. State ex rel.

776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked
permission to intervene or requested a hearing, the Commission may
grant the relief requested based on the application.

essential filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on April 26, 2000. The tariff's effective date is May 22, 2000. essential's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies essential as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. essential intends to provide interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services including 1+, 800/888/877 Services, Private Line, and Travel Card services.

In its memorandum filed on May 11, 2000, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) stated that essential's proposed services are similar to existing IXC offerings. Staff recommended that the Commission grant essential a certificate of interexchange service authority, and a certificate of service authority for local exchange telecommunication services on condition that this authority be restricted to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services. Staff recommended that the Commission grant essential competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules as requested. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff as amended to become effective on May 22, 2000.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications markets is in the public interest and essential should be granted

certificates of service authority. The Commission finds that the services essential proposes to offer are competitive and essential should be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that essential's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer, and is similar to tariffs approved for other Missouri certificated interexchange and nonswitched local exchange carriers. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on April 6, 2000, shall be approved as amended to become effective on May 22, 2000.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That essential.com, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to the conditions of certification set out above.
- 2. That essential.com, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri limited to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.
- 3. That essential.com, Inc., is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
