ORDER GRANTING INTERVENTION

On January 15, 1999, Missouri Gas Energy (MGE) filed its

Tariff Sheet P.S.C. MO. No. 1, Tenth Revised Sheet No. 24.7, canceling

its Ninth Revised Sheet No. 24.7, thereby proposing an unscheduled

adjustment to the Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) Rate pursuant to the

provisions Sheet No. 15 of its tariff. The proposed adjustment

represented a net decrease in revenues of 10.32 percent, amounting to

\$27,254,794 annually. On January 27, 1999, pursuant to a favorable

staff recommendation, the Commission issued its Order approving MGE's

proposed adjustment on an interim basis, subject to refund. That

Order became effective on February 1, 1999.

On February 4, 1999, Kansas Pipeline Company (KPC) filed its application to intervene. KPC states that it supplies natural gas transportation services to MGE and that its interest herein, consequently, is different from that of the general public and cannot be represented adequately by any other party to this proceeding. Further, KPC states that permitting its intervention herein will serve the public interest by permitting input from one of MGE's material transporters. KPC points out that its corporate predecessors have

been permitted by the Commission to intervene in MGE's previous PGA actions.

The Commission has reviewed KPC's application to intervene and finds that it is in substantial compliance with the Commission's rules regarding intervention, 4 CSR 240-2.075. The Commission also finds that KPC has an interest in this matter different from that of the general public and that its interest cannot be adequately represented by any other party. Finally, the Commission agrees with KPC's contention that the public interest will be served by granting its application to intervene. Therefore, the Commission will grant the request for intervention.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Kansas Pipeline Company is granted intervention in this case in accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.075(4).
 - That this order shall become effective on March 9, 1999.


