ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On April 13, 1994, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed a complaint against AA Mobile Home Sales, Inc. (AA Homes). AA Homes was notified of the complaint and on May 17, 1994, filed an answer to the complaint.

On June 8, 1994, a prehearing conference was held as scheduled. On June 13, 1994, the parties filed a joint motion to establish a procedural schedule.

The Commission is of the opinion that a hearing should be scheduled at which time Staff shall present its case in support of its complaint and AA Homes shall present its defense. The Commission is also of the opinion that, in order to facilitate the hearing process, a procedural schedule should be established; all parties should be required to file prepared testimony; and all parties should be required to file supporting or relied upon documents concurrent with the filing of testimony.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the Staff of the Commission shall file fifteen copies of its prepared direct testimony with the Executive Secretary of the Commission, and serve two copies of same upon AA Mobile Home Sales, Inc., on or before July 7, 1994.
- 2. That AA Mobile Home Sales, Inc. shall file fifteen copies of its prepared rebuttal testimony with the Executive Secretary of the Commission on or



before July 21, 1994.

- 3. That the Staff of the Commission shall file fifteen copies of its prepared surrebuttal testimony with the Executive Secretary of the Commission, and serve two copies of same upon AA Mobile Home Sales, Inc., on or before August 4, 1994.
- 4. That a prehearing conference is hereby scheduled for August 9, 1994, commencing at 10:00 a.m., in the Commission's hearing room on the fifth floor of the Harry S Truman State Office Building, Jefferson City, Missouri.
- 5. That a hearing in this matter is hereby scheduled for August 9, 1994, commencing immediately following the prehearing conference scheduled in Ordered Paragraph 4. Any person with special needs as addressed by the Americans With Disabilities Act shall notify the Chief Hearing Examiner (314/751-7497) at least ten days prior to the hearing.
 - 6. That this Order shall become effective on the date hereof.
