ORDER OF CONSOLIDATION AND SETTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On November 3, 1992, Western Resources, Inc., d/b/a Gas Service, a Western Resources Company (Gas Service), formerly known as The Kansas Power and Light Company, filed a Motion To Establish Procedural Schedule in Case No. GR-91-149. On November 10, 1992 the Commission's Staff (Staff) filed a Response To Motion To Establish Procedural Schedule supporting a different schedule and also filed a combined Motion To Consolidate this case with Case No. GR-90-40. On November 18, 1992 Gas Service filed a Reply agreeing to Staff's Motion To Consolidate and objecting to Staff's proposed procedural schedule and proposing either its original procedural schedule or an alternative procedural schedule. Case No. GR-91-149 began on August 23, 1991 when Gas Service filed a tariff to reflect a change in rates for natural gas service due to the recalculation of its 1990-1991 Actual Cost Adjustment (ACA) factors and the implementation of a rate to recover certain take-or-pay costs. Case No. GR-90-40 was established to maintain Gas Service's Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) rates for the 1989-1990 ACA period pending an agreement on an ACA factor for this period.

Until the ACA factor is resolved for the 1989-1990 ACA period the beginning balance for the 1990-1991 ACA period will not be known, and without that starting balance for the 1990-1991 ACA period, no factor can be developed.

Gas Service believes that its procedural schedules are more appropriate because there have already been extensive comments and only supplements are needed. Gas Service also states that it will have been nearly a year-and-a-half since the conclusion of the ACA period under consideration in Case No. GR-91-149 and Staff has had sufficient time to investigate and audit. Staff believes that its procedural schedule is more appropriate because it is having scheduling problems with its auditors who performed the audit on the 1990-1991 ACA period because they are presently involved in an audit of Southwestern Bell Telephone Company.

The Commission is in sympathy with both sides. The Commission feels that ACA audits are much too prolonged and has so expressed itself in previous orders. Likewise, however, the Commission also understands that Staff's resources are limited and necessarily certain types of cases are given priority over other cases. The Commission believes that Staff gives appropriate consideration to all regulated companies. Also, Staff should not be criticized for current work on ACA periods which should improve its efficiency in ACA cases. The Commission, therefore, determines that it is appropriate to consolidate Case No. GR-91-149 with Case No. GR-90-40 and that Staff's procedural schedule should be adopted for resolution of the issues in these cases, with modification to the hearing dates.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Case No. GR-91-149 and Case No. GR-90-40 are hereby consolidated and Case No. GR-90-40 is designated as the lead case for the consolidated cases.

2. That the following procedural schedule proposed by the Commission's Staff is hereby adopted with modification to the hearing dates:

Staff files rebuttal testimony

Prehearing conference

Gas Service files surrebuttal
testimony

Hearings
