O R D E R

On November 26, 1985, the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Alltel
Missouri, Inc., Missouri Independent Telephone Company Group and AT&T Communications
of the Southwest, Inc. (the Parties) filed a Motion for Extension of Time for Filing
Surrebuttal Testimony Concerning Pooling and Related Issues.

The Parties state that they are using the National Exchange Carrier
Association (NECA) data in their testimony and that Staff has requested and been
granted an extension of time to file surrebuttal testimony based on the recent
release of that data. The Parties further state that:

Fairness and equity require that all parties file
prepared surrebuttal testimony on a common date. No parties
should have the opportunity to file surrebuttal testimony
after reviewing and analyzing the surrebuttal testimony
filed by the other parties to this important docket.

The Parties request for all parties the same extension of time from November 26, 1985 to December 4, 1985 that Staff was granted to file its prepared surrebuttal testimony.

The Parties stated that the Staff, the Office of Public Counsel and MCI Telecommunications, Inc. do not oppose this Motion. The Parties stated that it was not necessary to delay the cross-examination of Dr. Ileo from the current schedule. The Parties also stated that Staff did not oppose their suggestion that the hearing scheduled be maintained as it is.


The Commission finds that the Parties' Motion is reasonable and should be granted. The Commission notes that Staff no longer needs to give a verbal description of its surrebuttal testimony. The Commission further notes that Dr. Ileo will remain scheduled to testify on December 11-12, 1985.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Alltel Missouri, Inc., Missouri Independent Telephone Company Group and AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc.'s Motion for Extension of Time for Filing Surrebuttal Testimony Concerning Pooling and Related Issues be, and hereby is, granted.

ORDERED: 2. That this Order shall become effective on the date hereof.
