**ORDER APPROVING TARIFF**

On November 10, 1993, NOSVA Limited Partnership (NOSVA) applied to the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) for a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri. On July 22, 1994, the Commission granted NOSVA's application and directed the company to file its tariff within thirty (30) days. NOSVA failed to file its tariff and, on September 6, 1994, the Commission issued a notice requiring the company to file its tariff by September 19, 1994. NOSVA's certificate of authority becomes effective upon the approval of its tariff by the Commission.

NOSVA filed its proposed tariff on September 19, 1994, reflecting the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use for providing services in Missouri. The tariff also reflects its status as a competitive telecommunications provider, and the statutory and regulatory requirements waived by the Commission pursuant to Section 392.420, RSMo Cum. Supp. 1993. NOSVA proposes to provide switched services, including "1+" long distance, 800 number, and travel card services. On October 7, 1994, NOSVA filed substitute sheets to amend its previously filed tariff.

On October 11, 1994, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) filed a memorandum giving its recommendation. Staff stated that it had reviewed the proposed tariff and substitute sheets and concluded that the tariff clearly and comprehensively describes the terms and conditions of the services to be offered, and that those services are within the scope of the certificate of authority conditionally granted. Staff concluded that the proposed tariff, as amended, is consistent with service offerings currently available from other interexchange carriers and approved by the Commission, is in compliance with Commission rules and regulations, and recommended that the tariff be approved as amended.

Having reviewed NOSVA's tariff and Staff's recommendation, the Commission finds that NOSVA's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer, and that the proposed tariff is similar to those which have been approved for other Missouri certificated interexchange carriers providing similar services. The Commission further finds that the proposed tariff filed September 19 and amended October 7, 1994, complies with the Commission's order and should be approved for service on and after October 19, 1994.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That the tariff filed by NOSVA Center, Inc. on September 19, 1994, is hereby approved, as amended, for service on and after October 19, 1994. The tariff approved is:

P.S.C. Mo. No. 1.

2. That this order shall become effective on the 19th day of October, 1994.
