RESPONSE OF AQUILA, INC. TO ORDER DIRECTING FILING

Comes now, Aquila, Inc. d/b/a Aquila Networks - L&P and Aquila Networks - MPS ("Aquila"), and for its response to the order directing filing issued by the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") in the caption-matters on August 8, 2002, respectfully states as follows:

- 1. By letter dated July 30, 2002, and received by the Commission on July 31, 2002, Aquila transmitted to the Commission for filing, pursuant to Section 393.190.1, RSMo, Aquila Networks MPS gas tariff sheets 17-32 and 32.1 through 32.24 and Aquila Networks L&P gas tariff sheets 7.1 through 7.4. All of said tariff sheets bore a date of issue of July 31, 2002, and an effective date of October 1, 2002, consistent with its prior discussions with the Commission Staff ("Staff"). Attached hereto as Appendix 1 is a copy of the transmittal letter accompanying said filing. Attached hereto as Appendix 2, is a copy of FedEx USA Airbill with Tracking No. 834224950620 indicating that said letter and filing was delivered to the Commission on July 31, 2002, and received by R. Doerhoff at 9:30 a.m. on that date.
 - 2. Prior to this submission, Aquila's Robert Amdor spoke with Staff members

Warren Wood and Tom Imhoff on July 17, 22 and 29, 2002. During the first conversation, Mr. Amdor generally described Aquila's proposed tariff and sent an electronic copy to the Staff for review. The electronic copy had not yet been inserted into tariff page format, so no titles or pages were show.

- the document by paragraph and discussed it in detail again on July 29, 2002. The July 29, 2002 version of the tariff was in final form, and showed the title as "Aquila, Inc. d/b/a Aquila Networks-MPS and Aquila Networks-L&P." During that last call, Mr. Amdor inquired as to whether the Staff had any concerns about an effective date of September 1, 2002, since Aquila's existing experimental aggregation tariff expired on August 31, 2002. Mr. Amdor was told by the Staff that it would be better to request an effective date of October 1, 2002, because that date would provide for a 60 day review period and an opportunity for changes before the November 1, 2002, date required by the aggregation statute. Mr. Amdor also asked whether there was any concern about filing the aggregation changes at the same time that Aquila filed changes designed to address Williams Pipeline's change to daily balancing, a major tariff re-write. Both Mr. Wood and Mr. Imhoff said they would prefer to handle all of the changes in one filing.
- 4. As stated previously, the involved tariff sheets were received by the Commission for filing on July 31, 2002, at 9:30 a.m. Thereafter, at approximately 4:00 p.m. on July 31, 2002, Mr. Amdor received a phone call from Mr. Imhoff and a Records Center member, at which time Mr. Amdor was advised, for the first time, that the Staff

wanted separate tariff sheets to be filed for MPS and L&P.¹ Said separate tariffs were completed and a new cover letter to be used in substituting/correcting the previously filed tariff sheets was faxed to the Staff for review on July 31, 2002. Attached hereto as Appendix 3 is a copy of said new cover letter.

5. Thereafter, on August 1, 2002, Mr. Amdor received a phone call from Mr. Imhoff at which time Mr. Imhoff indicated that the tariff changes should be refiled and not sent as a substitution/correction. A new cover letter and tariff sheets were then mailed to the Commission via FedEx for refiling as instructed and were received by the Commission on August 2, 2002, at 9:30 a.m. Attached hereto as Appendix 4 is a copy of said new cover letter.

WHEREFORE, Aquila respectfully requests that the Commission consider the foregoing explanation concerning the filing of the subject tariff sheets as having addressed its Order Directing Filing.
