AMEREN MISSOURI'S RESPONSE TO COMMISSION ORDER

COMES NOW, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri (Ameren Missouri or Company), and in response to the Missouri Public Service Commission's Order Directing Filing dated September 17, 2015 (Order), states as follows:

1. On September 9, 2015, the Commission issued an Order Directing Filing related to the discussion held in a Commission Agenda meeting held that same day. As the Order noted, in the Agenda meeting, "Commissioners raised two objections to the non-unanimous stipulation filed in this case by Ameren and other parties on June 30, 2015." The September 9th Order further explained that "...specifically, those objections were the absence of retrospective Evaluation, Measurement and Verification in calculating the throughput disincentive, and the absence of a component of supply side investment reduction in calculating the performance incentive." The Commission ordered the Company and the other parties to assess whether or not those objections could be resolved through negotiated resolution.

2. On September 16, 2015, Ameren Missouri responded that discussions were underway and the Company would be better able to respond to the Commission concerning the progress of those discussions by no later than September 22, 2015.

3. On September 17, 2015, the Commission further directed that:

"...[No] later than September 22, 2015, the parties shall file a pleading or pleadings stating whether they believe they can negotiate a MEEIA plan that would include retrospective Evaluation, Measurement, and

Verification (“EM&V”), and that would also include a Performance Incentive that has a component of supply-side investment reduction.”

4. Ameren Missouri is currently participating in discussions with stakeholders concerning a negotiated plan that would address both of the concerns expressed by the Commission in the September 9th Agenda session (as described in the paragraphs above). Presently, Ameren Missouri believes the discussions are productive and that a negotiated resolution is possible. Ameren Missouri requests that the Commission allow the Company until September 25, 2015, to report on progress toward the filing of a negotiated compromise, or in the alternative, whether a negotiated resolution is no longer believed to be feasible.

WHEREFORE, Ameren Missouri requests that the Commission grant it leave to file a status report by September 25, 2015, and for any other and further relief it deems appropriate.
