ORDER ADOPTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On June 18, 1999, the parties herein filed a proposed procedural schedule. The Commission has reviewed the proposed schedule and finds the dates appropriate for this case. Therefore, the Commission adopts the proposed schedule, except for the proposed telephone prehearing conference, and finds that the following conditions should be applied to the schedule:

(A) The Commission will require the prefiling of testimony as defined in 4 CSR 240-2.130. All parties shall comply with this rule, including the requirement that testimony be filed on line-numbered pages. The practice of prefiling testimony is designed to give parties notice of the claims, contentions and evidence in issue and to avoid unnecessary objections and delays caused by allegations of unfair surprise at the hearing.

(B) The parties shall file a list of the witnesses to appear on each day of the hearing and the order in which they shall be called, and the order of cross-examination for each witness. The parties have submitted a preliminary list of issues and agree to submit a final list on or before October 22, 1999. The Commission reminds the parties that any issue not contained in the final list of issues will be viewed as uncontested and not requiring resolution by the Commission.

(C) Each party shall file a statement of its position on each disputed issue. Such statement shall be simple and concise, and shall not contain argument about why the party believes its position to be the correct one. The position statement shall be filed in both paper form and electronically, either on computer disk or by e-mail. Electronically submitted documents should be in Word, Word Perfect or ASCII format.

(D) The Commission's general policy provides for the filing of the transcript within two weeks after the hearing. If any party seeks to expedite the filing of the transcript, such request shall be tendered in writing to the regulatory law judge at least five days prior to the date of the hearing.

(E) All pleadings, briefs and amendments shall be filed in accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.080. The briefs to be submitted by the parties shall follow the same list of issues as filed in the case. The briefs must set forth and cite the proper portions of the record concerning the remaining unresolved issues that are to be decided by the Commission. The Commission will establish a briefing schedule at the conclusion of the evidentiary hearing.

(F) All parties are required to bring an adequate number of copies of exhibits which they intend to offer into evidence at the

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hearing. If an exhibit has been prefiled, only three copies of the exhibit are necessary for the court reporter. If an exhibit has not been prefiled, the party offering it should bring, in addition to the three copies for the court reporter, copies for the five Commissioners, the regulatory law judge, and all counsel.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

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1. That the following procedural schedule is adopted for this case, with the conditions set out above:

Rebuttal testimony of all other parties	October 7, 1999 3:00 PM
Prehearing Conference	October 18, 1999 10:00 AM
Final list of issues, order of witnesses, order of cross-examination	October 22, 1999 3:00 PM
Surrebuttal testimony or Cross-surrebuttal testimony, all parties	November 18, 1999 3:00 PM
Position Statements of each party on all issues	November 29, 1999 3:00 PM
Evidentiary Hearing	December 6-14, 1999 9:00 AM
