UTILICORP DISCONTINUES PLANS TO SELL ITS U.S. NETWORK CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE BUSINESS

KANSAS CITY, MO, April 24, 2001 — UtiliCorp United (NYSE: UCU) today announced that it has discontinued its efforts to sell the company's utility network construction and maintenance business and related assets.

In November last year, UtiliCorp announced a competitive bid process for the business, which supports the company's electricity and natural gas network transmission and distribution operations in seven states.

"While there were sincere and extensive discussions during the past several months with potential purchasers of the business, we did not find an arrangement that would be mutually beneficial for employees and customers and also achieve value for UtiliCorp shareholders," said James G. Miller, UtiliCorp senior vice president and CEO of the company's U.S. Utility unit. However, he added that the company remains committed to the concept of unbundling utility services such as those the company has successfully unbundled in its overseas operations.

The potential sale in the U.S. would have affected about 900 UtiliCorp employees plus the equipment involved in operations and related engineering work on the company's electricity and natural gas networks in Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri and Nebraska.

Based in Kansas City, Mo., UtiliCorp United is a multinational energy company with more than 4 million customers. It operates in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Spain, Germany, Norway, New Zealand and Australia. At December 31, 2000, UtiliCorp had \$14.1 billion in assets and annual sales of \$29.0 billion.
