ORDER AND NOTICE OF PEARING

On December 30, 1988, Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL) filed its Motion To Confirm Termination Of Steam Utility Service And To Close Docket seeking an order determining that it had performed all obligations under the Commission's Report and Order issued October 7, 1987.

On January 10, 1989, an Application To Intervene was filed on behalf of Kinetic Energy Development Corporation (Kinetic), prospective purchaser and operator of KCPL's steam distribution system in the City of Kansas City.

On January 20, 1989, the Commission Staff filed a Response and Recommendation which includes the setting of a hearing prior to April 2, 1989, for the receipt of reports from KCPL and Kinetic as to the status of negotiations for the sale of the downtown steam system. The Commission is of the opinion that the recommendation should be accepted and a hearing set to receive reports from KCPL and Kinetic as to the status of negotiations for the sale of the KCPL downtown steam system. The Commission is also of the opinion that the Application To Intervene filed by Kinetic should be granted.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That the Application To Intervene filed on behalf of Kinetic Energy Development Corporation be, and is, hereby granted.

ORDERED: 2. That a hearing is hereby set in this matter, for the purposes hereinabove specified, commencing at 10:00 a.m., on the 27th day of March, 1989, in the Commission's offices in the Harry S Truman State Office Building, in Jefferson City, Missouri.

ORDERED: 3. That this Order shall become effective on the date hereof.
