ORDER APPROVING EXCHANGE BOUNDARY REVISION

On July 23, 1990, United Telephone Company of Missouri (United) submitted tariffs which reflect a proposed boundary change between the Brazito exchange and the Russellville exchange. The tariffs have an effective date of August 23, 1990 but United requested the tariffs be allowed to go into effect in less than 30 days. This docket was created to consider the tariffs and the request for expedited treatment.

On August 6, 1990, Commission Staff filed a memorandum recommending the Commission approve the tariffs and make them effective before August 23, 1990. Staff indicates that the boundary exchange proposed is to accommodate an existing customer who is currently served from the Brazito exchange. United proposes to now serve this customer from the Russellville exchange. By changing the exchange boundaries United will be able to serve the customer by underground facilities rather than by a drop temporarily placed across a river as the customer is now being served.

The Commission has reviewed this matter and has determined the proposed tariffs will be approved. The customer will receive a better quality of service after the proposed change. The Commission also finds there is good cause for a less than 30-day effective date for the tariffs.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the tariffs filed by United Telephone Company of Missouri to revise exchange boundaries are hereby approved.

2. That this order shall become effective on the 11th day of August, 1990.
