ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE AND TARIFF

Sprint Spectrum L.P. filed an application on July 1, 1998, asking the Commission to cancel its interexchange certificate and tariff, issued by the Commission on March 18, 1997, in Case No. TA-97-266. The Commission had approved Sprint Spectrum L.P. to provide resold intrastate interexchange services. Sprint Spectrum L.P. stated it had since determined its current business plan did not require the type of authority the Commission had granted to Sprint Spectrum L.P. so it wished to have its certificate canceled.

The Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed a Memorandum regarding the proposed cancellation of Sprint Spectrum L.P.'s certificate and related tariff on July 15, 1998. The Staff stated it had reviewed Sprint Spectrum L.P.'s application and had no objection to the Commission issuing an order canceling the certificate and related tariff previously issued to Sprint Spectrum L.P. The Staff indicated it had contacted Sprint Spectrum L.P.'s attorney who verbally confirmed Sprint Spectrum L.P. had no customers in the State of Missouri. The Staff stated it was unaware of any other filing which affects or which would be affected by the Commission taking this action.


Section 392.410 gives the Commission authority to cancel a telecommunications company's certificate of service authority. The

Commission has reviewed Sprint Spectrum L.P.'s application, Staff's motion and recommendation, and the official file and finds that the interexchange certificate and tariff granted to Sprint Spectrum L.P. in Case No. TA-97-266 shall be canceled.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the interexchange certificate and tariff granted to Sprint Spectrum L.P. in Case No. TA-97-266 are canceled.
2. That this order shall become effective on August 4, 1998.
