MOTION TO CANCEL CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff), and moves that the Commission cancel the payphone certificates of service authority of Mays Medical Properties, Inc. In support of its *Motion*, Staff respectfully states:

1. In September 1997, Mays Medical Properties, Inc. received a certificate of service authority from the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) to provide private pay telephone services, pursuant to the Commission's authority under Section 386.250, RSMo 2000. The certificate was granted in Case No. TA-98-35.

2. The corporation is in good standing according to the Missouri Secretary of State's website, and mail has not been returned from the company's address.

3. However, the company has not returned the Commission's Statement of Revenue form for at least the past four years. The Commission has assessed the company with an estimated assessment of \$0.00.

4. Staff contacted one of the corporate officers of Mays Medical Properties, Inc., and was provided an email that stated: "It is our intention to cancel the certificate to provide payphone service for Mays Medical Properties, Inc. ... [W]e are not exercising that certificate and do not intend to do so. Please cancel the certificate."

5. Mays Medical Properties, Inc. is not delinquent in paying any assessments that may have been assessed during the history of their registration with the Commission. As a payphone provider, the company is not required to submit annual reports to the Commission.

6. Staff has made an investigation and no other matters are pending in front of the Commission.

7. The Commission has the authority to cancel a certificate to provide payphone services pursuant to Section 392.410.5 RSMo 2000, which provides:

Any certificate of service authority may be altered or modified by the commission after notice and hearing, upon its own motion or upon application of the person or company affected.

However, the Commission need not hold a hearing, if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing. *State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission*, 776 S.W.2d 494 (Mo.App. 1989).

8. Staff is serving this pleading on the registered agent for the company listed on the website of the Secretary of State. Section 352.380(1) RSMo 2000 provides:

The registered agent so appointed by a corporation upon whom any process, notice or demand required or permitted by law to be served upon a corporation may be served.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(17)(C)(1) states "Service by mail is complete upon mailing." Staff is also serving this pleading upon the address provided by the company.

WHEREFORE, the Staff recommends the Commission cancel the certificate of service authority of Mays Medical Properties, Inc. to provide private pay telephone service.




