SECRETARY OF STATE

#### 4 CSR 240-2.030 Records of the Commission.

PURPOSE: This amendment replaces references to secretary with the phrase secretary of the commission. The amendment clarifies the charge for copies of briefs and facsimile transmissions. The provision regarding the availability of records for public inspection is updated.

- (1) The secretary of the commission shall keep a full and true record of all the proceedings of the commission, of all books, maps, documents and papers ordered filed by the commission, of all orders made by each of the commissioners, and of all orders made by the commission or approved and confirmed by it and ordered filed. In addition, the secretary of the commission shall maintain a docket of all [proceedings] cases filed and [proceedings] cases set for hearing and shall assign each matter an appropriate [docket] case number. These records shall be available for public inspection in the office of the secretary of the commission, [from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.,] during reasonable business hours, Monday through Friday, except for legal holidays. The specific hours the records are available shall be posted at the principal office of the commission.
- (2) Copies of records, official documents, pleadings, transcripts, **briefs**, and orders filed with the commission may be requested from the secretary **of the commission**. Any such request [must] **shall** be made in writing. Copies of records, official documents, pleadings, transcripts, **briefs**, and orders furnished to public officers for use in their official capacity [will] **may** be provided without charge. Copies [will] **shall** be provided to all others as follows:
  - (A) Records, official documents, pleadings, briefs, and orders, thirty-five cents (35¢) per page:
  - (B) Certificate under seal, one dollar (\$1);
  - (C) Transmittal by [electronic telephone] facsimile device, fifty cents (50¢) per page;
- (D) Copies of official transcripts, fifty cents  $(50\phi)$  per page. A diskette shall be provided upon request with a request for a printed copy of the transcript.

PUBLIC ENTITY COST: This proposed rescission will not cost state agencies or political subdivisions more than \$500 in the aggregate.

PRIVATE ENTITY COST: This proposed rescission will not cost private entities more than \$500 in the aggregate.

NOTICE TO SUBMIT COMMENTS: Anyone may file a statement in support of or in opposition to this proposed rescission with the Missouri Public Service Commission, Dale Hardy Roberts, Secretary, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, MO 65102. To be considered, the comments shall be filed on or before August 16, 1999. Comments should refer to Case No. OX-2000-13 and be filed with an original and fourteen (14) copies. No public hearing is scheduled.

Dear Mr. Roberts:

Executive Order 93-13 requires state agencies to undertake a "takings analysis" of each proposed rule or regulation in light of the United States Supreme Court decision in *Lucas v. South Carolina Coastal Council*, 112 S. Ct. 2886 (1992). Pursuant to that order, I have undertaken a "takings analysis" of the above-referenced proposed rulemaking. In *Lucas*, the Court held that state regulation depriving an owner of real property of all economically beneficial use of that property constitutes a "taking" under the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments of the U.S. Constitution, for which the property owner must be compensated. The Court also held that when state regulations compel a property owner to suffer a permanent physical invasion of his/her property, such an invasion is compensable.

The proposed amendment clarifies that references to "secretary" mean "secretary of the commission". The amendment clarifies the charge for copies of briefs and faxes. The provision regarding the availability of records for public inspection is updated.

Amending rule 4 CSR 240-2.030 does not implicate the takings clause of the U.S. Constitution, because the rule does not involve the taking of real property.
