## ORDER DENYING REHEARING

On April 13, 1999, the Commission issued its Order Denying Intervention and Approving Stipulation and Agreement, which denied the application for intervention filed by GS Technology Operating Company, Inc. d/b/a GST Steel Company<sup>1</sup> (GST) on February 2, 1999. In addition, the Commission's order issued April 13, 1999 denied GST's request for a hearing filed February 2, 1999 and GST's motion to compel filed April 12, 1999.

On April 22, 1999, GST filed its Application for Rehearing, Motion for Reconsideration and Suggestions in Support of its Motion (application). GST alleged in its application that the Commission's order was insufficient as a matter of law and violated GST's due rights in that the Commission failed to follow the requirements of Section 386.420, RSMo. On April 30, 1999, Kansas City Power & Light filed its reply to GST's application for rehearing and motion for reconsideration requesting the Commission deny both of

GST's requests summarily since GST's application did not raise any new matters that had not been addressed previously by the Commission.

Pursuant to Section 386.500, RSMo 1994, and Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.160(3), the Commission shall grant a rehearing if in its judgment there is sufficient reason to do so. GST has had full opportunity to file its complaint through the appropriate procedures and has done so. The Commission finds that there is not sufficient reason to grant rehearing or reconsideration, and the Commission will deny GST's application.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the Application For Rehearing And Motion For Reconsideration filed by GST Steel Company on April 22, 1999 is denied.
- 2. That this order shall become effective on February 14, 2000.
  - 3. That this case may be closed on February 15, 2000.
