ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE AND NONSWITCHED LOCAL EXCHANGE **CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF**

Global Time, Inc. (Global Time), applied to the Public Service Commission on July 8, 1999, for certificates of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.410-.450, RSMo 1994, and RSMo Supp. 1998.¹ Global Time asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. Global Time is a Delaware corporation, with its principal office located at 500 Airport Boulevard, Suite 340, Burlingame, California 94010.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications for Intrastate Certificates of Service Authority and Opportunity to Intervene on July 20, 1999, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by August 4, 1999. Due to an error in the notice a corrected notice was issued on July 27, 1999.

On August 3, 1999, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT) filed an application to intervene. Later, on August 18, 1999, SWBT withdrew its application stating that SWBT's concerns had been addressed and that intervention was no longer necessary. No other party sought to intervene and no party has been granted intervention.

The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. <u>State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer</u> <u>Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission</u>, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has intervened or requested a hearing, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the verified application.

Global Time filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on August 26, 1999. The tariff's effective date is December 9, 1999. Global Time's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies Global Time as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. Global Time intends to provide interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services including debit card services.

In its memorandum filed on November 24, 1999, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) recommended that the Commission grant Global Time a certificate of interexchange service authority, and a certificate of service authority for local exchange telecommunication services on condition that this authority be restricted to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services. Staff recommended

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that the Commission grant Global Time competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff as amended to become effective on December 9, 1999.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications markets is in the public interest and Global Time should be granted certificates of service authority. The Commission finds that the services Global Time proposes to offer are competitive and Global Time should be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that Global Time's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on July 8, 1999, shall be approved as amended to become effective on December 9, 1999.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Global Time, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to the conditions of certification set out above.

2. That Global Time, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri limited to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services, subject to all

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applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.

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3. That Global Time, Inc., is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
