ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE AND LOCAL EXCHANGE CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

Feist Long Distance Service, Inc. (Feist) applied to the Public Service Commission on February 5, 1998 for a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange and local exchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Section 392.410-.450, RSMo 1994¹. Feist asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. Feist is a Kansas corporation, with its principal office located at 110 South Main Street, Suite 1000, Wichita, Kansas 67202.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications and Opportunity to Intervene on February 18, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by March 5. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. State ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked permission to intervene or

requested a hearing, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the verified application.

Feist filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed substitute sheets on March 12 and 13. The tariff's effective date is March 25. Feist's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies Feist as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. Feist intends to provide interexchange and local exchange telecommunications services including 1+ direct dial, 800/888/877, directory assistance and travel card services.

In its Memorandum filed on March 18, the Staff of the Commission stated that Feist's proposed services are similar to existing IXC offerings. Staff recommended that the Commission grant Feist a certificate of interexchange service authority, and a certificate of service authority for local exchange telecommunication services on condition that this authority be restricted to providing dedicated, non-switched local exchange private line services. Staff recommended that the Commission grant Feist competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff to become effective on March 25.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange and local exchange telecommunications markets is in the public interest and Feist should be granted a certificate of service authority. The Commission finds that the services Feist proposes to offer are competitive and Feist should be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that Feist's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer, and is similar to tariffs approved for other Missouri certificated interexchange and local exchange carriers. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on February 5 shall be approved as amended to become effective on March 25.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Feist Long Distance Service, Inc. is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to the conditions of certification set out above.
- 2. That Feist Long Distance Service, Inc. is granted a certificate of service authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri limited to providing dedicated, nonswitched local exchange private line services, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except as specified in this order.
- 3. That Feist Long Distance Service, Inc. is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
