ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

On December 20, 1994, Multimedia Long Distance Company (Multimedia) filed tariff sheets in the above-referenced case relating to its dedicated interexchange digital private line services as well as relating to a specific special promotion which the company intended to start offering on January 2, 1995. The Company requested expedited approval of the tariff.

On January 11, 1995, the Telecommunication Department Staff (Staff) of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed its Memorandum in which it recommended approval of the above-referenced tariff. Staff has stated in its Memorandum that Multimedia has filed a tariff sheet regarding its dedicated interexchange digital private line services and Staff has further stated that this tariff relates primarily to the technological provisions underlying this service. Multimedia has also filed special promotions regarding a limited promotion available to non-residential commercial customers subscribing to long-distance services. Staff has reviewed the tariff and states that Multimedia was recently granted a Certificate of Service Authority and its tariff was approved in Case No. TA-95-83. Multimedia had proposed to offer private line service in the draft tariff attached with its original application. When Multimedia filed

a proposed tariff in compliance with the Order and Notice to File Tariff, the last sheet was inadvertently omitted. This sheet has been refiled and contains the descriptions of two (2) private line service offerings. The first service, Voice Grade Facility, proposes to offer a point-to-point 64 Kbps digital interface for voice or data. The second service DS1/1.544 Mbps Facility, proposes to offer a point-to-point 1.544 Mbps digital interface on either a channelized or non-channelized basis. Both services would be priced on an individual case basis (ICB). Multimedia has provided language in its tariff stating that the service would not be priced below cost and that specific ICB contracts would be made available upon request on a proprietary basis.

Multimedia is also proposing to offer a promotion for three (3) services that, if approved, would offer reduced rates to the first three hundred (300) commercial customers subscribing to the services. Customers eligible for the promotion could select a service commitment of 1, 2, or 3 years. At the Staff's request, Multimedia filed a substitute sheet clarifying that the promotion would not be offered for a period exceeding one (1) year. The Staff requested this modification in order that the promotion, if approved, would be consistent with promotions previously approved by the Commission.

The Commission has reviewed the tariff, the Staff Memorandum and the entirety of the file and makes the following findings of fact. The Commission finds that Multimedia has stated good cause for expedited service. The Commission finds that the tariff sheets contain terms and conditions of telecommunications services which are similar to those provided by other carriers in the state of Missouri and the Commission finds that approval of these tariffs is not detrimental to the public interest.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:


