<u>REPORT AND ORDER</u>

The instant docket was created to handle the several applications filed by various telephone companies under the Commission's jurisdiction requesting revised depreciation rates on Account Nos. 231.0 and 234.0. The Commission, by order issued on December 3, 1982, consolidated the applications then on file with the instant docket created therein, and set the matter for hearing. No applications to intervene have been filed.

The prehearing conference was convened on December 20, 1982, at which time the companies which had filed similar applications for revised depreciation rates subsequent to the Commission's December 3, 1982, order were consolidated with the instant docket. On December 20, 1982, the formal hearing was called to order.

Findings of Fact

A stipulation and agreement marked Joint Exhibit No. 2 was presented to the Commission at the hearing by the signatory parties. After presentation and discussion of the stipulation and agreement, the hearing was adjourned for consideration of the stipulation by the Commission.

The stipulation and agreement as it was presented in its entirety is as follows:

STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT

Comes now the undersigned parties to the above-captioned docket and stipulate and agree as follows:

- That effective December 1, 1982, the Company is authorized to accrue depreciation on Account 231.0 and/or Account 234.0 at an annual rate equal to its plant investment in such account(s) as of November 30, 1982, minus the associated reserve(s) as of November 30, 1982, divided by the product of 2.5416 times the plant investment as of November 30, 1982. This annual rate, divided by twelve, will be applied to the gross investment in Accounts 231 and 234, except for amounts representing investment in over voltage protection equipment, inside wiring, coin operated or pay telephones, multiplexing equipment, mobile radio equipment, paging equipment, transmit earth stations, and official telephones and other official switching equipment, for the month of December, 1982, hereinafter referred to as the original base amount. For the month of January, 1983 such original base amount shall be reduced by one-sixtieth. Each month thereafter, the base amount shall be reduced by one-sixtieth of the original base amount.
- 2. That the Company agrees to offer at a time prior to the deregulation or detariffing of terminal equipment by the Commission or by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) a sales option for such terminal equipment to its customers. The sales option will offer such terminal equipment at prices no greater than required to recover the remaining investment in Account(s) 231.0 and/or 234.0 (net book cost) at the date of the offering plus an incremental amount to recover the cost of making such sales.
- 3. That the details of the sales option offering are to be established by a Commission approved tariff and the parties hereto agree to work in good faith towards mutually agreeable terms in order to implement the pricing stipulated to in paragraph 2 herein and to promote the sale of terminal equipment pursuant to the sales option.
- 4. The parties hereto have entered into this Stipulation and Agreement for the sole purpose of determining depreciation expense and the related accruals to the accumulated depreciation reserve for Accounts 231 and 234, except as otherwise specifically provided herein, and are not bound by its terms with regard to any other depreciation, accounting or ratemaking principle.
- 5. That in the event the Commission accepts the specific terms of this Stipulation and Agreement, the parties waive their respective rights to present oral argument or written briefs, pursuant to Section 536.080(1), RSMo 1978.
- 6. That in the event the Commission accepts the specific terms of this Stipulation and Agreement, the parties waive their respective rights pertaining to the reading of the transcript by the Commission pursuant to Section 536.080(2), RSMo 1978.
- 7. That in the event the Commission accepts the specific terms of this Stipulation and Agreement, the parties waive their respective rights to judicial review, pursuant to Section 386.510, RSMo 1978.

8. That the agreements in this Stipulation and Agreement have resulted from extensive negotiations between the signatory parties and are interdependent. In the event the Commission does not approve and adopt the terms of this Stipulation and Agreement in total in accordance with the provisions contained herein, this Stipulation and Agreement shall be void and no party shall be bound by any of the agreements or provisions hereof.

On December 28, 1982, the attorney for the Staff informed the Commission that all attorneys of record have consented to a modification of the foregoing stipulation and agreement. All parties have agreed to delete the second sentence of Paragraph 2 contained in the foregoing stipulation and agreement and in its place insert a new second sentence, with the first sentence to remain as originally proposed, as follows:

"The sales option will offer such terminal equipment at a price to be determined by the Commission at such time as is appropriate due to the announcement of the detariffing or deregulation of terminal equipment, but will, in any event, include an amount to recover the cost of making such sales."

Conclusions

The telephone companies listed in the stipulation are public utilities subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission pursuant to Chapters 386 and 392, R.S.Mo. 1978. For ratemaking purposes, the Commission may accept a stipulated settlement of any contested matter submitted by the parties. In the instant docket the parties to the stipulation have agreed to revised depreciation rates and other matters which, as modified, the Commission finds to be reasonable and proper. The Commission also recognizes the modification set out herein and hereby finds the stipulation and agreement to be modified in accordance with the foregoing.

The Commission also concludes that its actions herein shall be strictly limited to the unique facts and circumstances of this case, which has been considered by the Commission on a highly expedited basis.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That the stipulation and agreement entered into between the Missouri Public Service Commission Staff, the Office of Public Counsel and the following telephone utilities:
