

ORDER DENYING MOTION

On March 5, 1987, Intervenor, Doe Run Company, a partnership of St. Joe Minerals Corporation and Homestake Lead Mining Company of Missouri, and Intervenor, ASARCO, Inc., filed their Motion to Suspend Phase-in Tariffs seeking an order of this Commission suspending the second year phase-in tariffs filed by Arkansas Power & Light Company with a proposed effective date of March 21, 1987. Responses to the motion have been filed by Company, the Commission Staff, and Union Electric Company. The Commission Staff has reviewed the proposed tariffs and recommended approval as being correctly reflective of the rates subject to the second year phase-in as previously ordered by the Commission.

Upon consideration of the motion and the responses thereto, the Commission is of the opinion that the motion should be denied and that the second year phase-in


tariffs should be allowed to go into effect on the proposed effective date of March 21, 1987.

ORDERED: 1. That the Motion to Suspend Phase-in Tariffs filed herein on March 5, 1987, be, and is, hereby denied.


