ORDER DESIGNATING MARK TWAIN COMMUNICATIONS COMPANY AN ELIGIBLE CARRIER

Mark Twain Communications Company (Mark Twain) filed an application on March 22, 2000, requesting designation as an eligible telecommunications carrier pursuant to Section 254 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 and Federal Communications Commission regulations 47 CFR 54.201 et seq. Mark Twain states that it provides the services supported by federal universal service support using a combination of its own facilities and leased facilities, and advertises the availability of these services.

The Commission gave notice and an opportunity to intervene to all certificated Missouri local exchange and interexchange carriers. No entity moved to intervene or requested a hearing. The requirement for a hearing is met when the opportunity for hearing has been provided and no proper party has requested the opportunity to present evidence. State



ex rel. Rex Deffenderfer Enterprises, Inc. v. Public Service Commission, 776 S.W.2d 494, 496 (Mo. App. 1989). Since no one has asked permission to intervene or requested a hearing, the Commission may grant the relief requested based on the application.

On May 12, 2000, the Staff of the Commission (Staff) filed its recommendation. Staff stated that it had reviewed Mark Twain's application and determined that Mark Twain meets each of the provisions of Federal Communications Commission regulations 47 CFR 54.201(d). Staff recommends that the Commission grant the relief requested in the application. Staff notes that Mark Twain will be the first competitive local exchange carrier to be designated an eligible carrier.

The Commission has reviewed the application and the Staff recommendation, and finds that Mark Twain has met the requirements to be designated as a telecommunications carrier eligible to receive federal universal service support. The Commission will grant the relief requested in Mark Twain's application.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That Mark Twain Communications Company is eligible under the provisions of 47 CFR 54.201(d) to receive federal universal service fund support.

2. That this order shall become effective on June 27, 2000.


