ORDER FINDING NECESSITY FOR RULEMAKING

On January 18, 2000, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission and Staff) filed a motion opening a case to consider the proposed rescission of Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-122 - Recreational Vehicles¹.

On September 7, 2000, the Commission ordered the Staff to file a status report on this case no later than September 22, 2000. On that date, the Staff reported to the Commission that pursuant to recent legislation, the Commission no longer has authority over recreational vehicles. Therefore, the Staff concluded, the rescission of this rule is sought through the rulemaking process. Staff also stated that it had a number of rulemaking cases that are at different stages of completion. This particular case, Staff claimed, was then not yet ready to be submitted to the Commission for its review. However, Staff advised the Commission that

a rulemaking packet would be filed for review no later than October 24, 2000.

On October 24, 2000, Staff filed its motion for finding of necessity for rulemaking with a memorandum attached in support of its motion.

Staff noted that all Commission recreational vehicle regulations have been repealed, leaving the Commission with no jurisdiction over recreational vehicles.

The Staff thus requested that the Commission, based on Staff's arguments, find that the proposed rescission is necessary to update and make uniform the rules pertaining to manufactured housing. The Commission will grant that request.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission is authorized to complete the necessary procedures of the Commission and the applicable procedures of administrative rulemaking and may file a proposed rescission of Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-122 Recreational Vehicles for consideration.
 - 2. That this order shall become effective on November 12, 2000.
