ORDER CONCERNING PUBLIC COUNSEL'S SECOND MOTION TO COMPEL

On March 31, 2000, the Office of the Public Counsel (Public Counsel) filed its Second Motion to Compel and Request for Expedited Consideration, in which Public Counsel asserted that its ability to timely file its direct testimony in this case was impaired due to the failure of Missouri-American Water Company (MAWC) to respond to several Data Requests (DRs).

On April 4, 2000, in order to promptly resolve this dispute and maintain the progress of this case toward resolution, the Commission by Order shortened the time for response to this motion. MAWC timely filed its response on April 6, 2000, asserting that it had responded to all of Public Counsel's DRs and moving that Public Counsel's motion, consequently, be denied. Public Counsel filed no reply, although the Order of April 4, 2000, allowed it to file such up to 1:00 p.m. on Friday, April 7, 2000.

As Public Counsel has not replied in opposition to MAWC's response, the Commission necessarily concludes that Public Counsel has abandoned its Second Motion to Compel.



IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Public Counsel's Second Motion to Compel is denied.
- 2. That this order shall become effective on April 21, 2000.
