## ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE OF PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Trans National Telecommunications, Inc. (Trans National) filed an application with the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) on December 3, 1999, for a certificate of service authority to provide resold basic local telecommunications service in portions of the state of Missouri and for competitive classification.

The Commission issued an order on December 14, 1999, directing Trans National to cure a deficiency in its application by informing the Commission of the character of the business performed by Trans National, which it did on December 30, 1999.

On December 21, 1999, the Commission issued its notice of applications, ordering entities wishing to intervene to file their requests by January 20, 2000. On January 10, 2000, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company filed an application to intervene, which was granted on February 1, 2000.

Also on February 1, 2000, the Commission ordered, inter alia, that the parties file a procedural schedule no later than February 16,

On February 16, 2000, Trans National filed its motion to extend the time within which to file a procedural schedule for thirty (30) days in order to allow time for negotiation of a stipulation and Trans National did not state the positions of the other parties, nor did any other party respond to Trans National's motion to Trans National, in fact, did not show that it had served its motion to extend on the Staff of the Commission, so was ordered to file a certificate of service showing that it had filed its motion to extend on the Staff. Trans National filed its response to that order on February 29, 2000, along with a certificate of service on Staff, showing that Trans National had served Staff on February 28, 2000. Trans National also stated "[t]he Commission should note...that general counsel was served a copy of [Trans National's motion to extend] on or about February 16, 2000 by members of the Commission's Records staff." Commission reiterates that it was The National's lack of certificate of service, and not the actual service itself, which prompted the Commission's order directing filing.

The Commission will grant Trans National's motion to extend the time within which to file a procedural schedule.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the parties shall file a proposed procedural schedule no later than 3:00 p.m. on April 6, 2000.

2. That this order shall become effective on March 17, 2000.
