ORDER APPROVING TARIFFS

On August 20, 1993, ALLTEL Missouri, Inc., submitted a proposed tariff designed to allow waivers of service connection charges to victims of the flooding which occurred this past summer. The waiver will allow the waiver of service connection charges to victims of the flooding who seek permanent or temporary residence in any ALLTEL exchange. This proposed tariff was docketed as Case No. TT-94-55. Also on August 20, 1993, Eastern Missouri Telephone Company submitted a proposed tariff designed for the same purposes as ALLTEL's tariff. This tariff was docketed as Case No. TT-94-56. Also on August 20, 1993, Missouri Telephone Company submitted a proposed tariff designed for the same purposes as those of ALLTEL and Eastern Missouri. This tariff was docketed as Case No. TT-94-57. The companies requested the tariffs be processed in seven days if possible.

On August 27, 1993 Commission Staff filed a memorandum recommending the Commission approve the proposed tariffs of all these companies. Staff states that the proposed waivers would (1) waive service connection charges when a

flooding victim customer establishes telephone service at an interim location, and (2) waive the service connection charge if the customer reestablished service at either the original or another location. The waivers are to be available until December 31, 1993. Staff indicates that the three companies filed substitute tariff sheets on August 24, 1993.

The Commission has considered the proposed tariffs and Staff's recommendation and will approve the tariffs. These tariffs are similar to others approved by the Commission as a reasonable response to the emergency situation resulting from the summer flood. The Commission finds there is also good cause to approve the tariffs on less than thirty days notice.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the proposed tariff, as amended, submitted by ALLTEL Missouri, Inc., to waive service connection charges for flood victims be hereby approved for service on and after September 1, 1993.

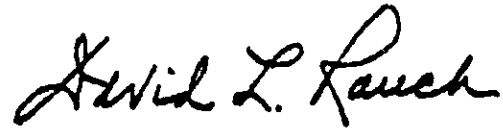
