On October 28, 2020, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed an application for a certificate of convenience and necessity to construct, install, own, operate, maintain, and otherwise control and manage a solar electric generating facility in Montgomery County, Missouri, to serve as the second program resource for its expanded Community Solar Program.

The Commission directed notice and set a deadline of November 20, 2020, for applications to intervene. On November 3, 2020, Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri filed a timely application to intervene.

More than ten days have passed since the application was filed and no one has responded. After considering the unopposed application to intervene, the Commission finds that Renew Missouri has interests which are different from that of the general public and allowing it to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The application to intervene of Renew Missouri is granted.

2. This order shall be effective when issued.
