ORDER OF IMPLEMENTATION/DISMISSAL

On December 29, 1989, the Commission issued a Report and Order in Case No. TO-87-131 directing the local exchange companies (LECs) in the State of Missouri to offer an extra-exchange calling program at less than toll rates in exchanges demonstrating a community of interest. This program of extra-exchange calling is called community optional service (COS). In its Report and Order of December 29, 1989, the Commission established that a community of interest is demonstrated when an average of six calls per access line per month are made from the petitioning exchange to the requested exchange and two-thirds of the customers in the petitioning exchange make two or more calls to the requested exchange per month.

Of the routes studied herein, the routes from the East Lynne exchange to the Harrisonville exchange and from the East Lynne exchange to the Kansas City Metropolitan area met the standard demonstrating a community of interest. The route from the East Lynne exchange to the Pleasant Hill exchange did not meet the standard demonstrating a community of interest. Therefore, the Commission will direct the LECs providing service to the East Lynne exchange, the Harrisonville exchange and the Kansas City Metropolitan area to offer COS on these routes as set forth below. The Commission will dismiss the East Lynne/Pleasant Hill route.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the local exchange companies providing service to the East Lynne exchange, the Harrisonville exchange and the Kansas City Metropolitan area be directed hereby to provide community optional service (COS) in these exchanges within 120 days from the date that the results of the calling study were filed with this Commission.
- 2. That the local exchange companies responsible for providing community optional service (COS) on the East Lynne/Harrisonville route and the East Lynne/Kansas City Metropolitan area route be directed hereby to inform the Commission when COS is implemented.
 - 3. That the East Lynne/Pleasant Hill route be dismissed hereby.
 - 4. That this order shall become effective on the 26th day of June, 1990.
