MERAMEC SEWER CO. for permission,
approval, and a certificate of con-
venience and necessity authorizing
it to construct, operate and maintain
a sanitary sewage disposal system in
a certain designated area in Jefferson
County, Missouri.

ORDER CLOSING CASE

On March 21, 1977, Meramec Sewer Co. (Applicant) filed an application with the Commission requesting that it be granted authority to construct, operate and maintain a sanitary sewer system in a certain designated area in Jefferson County, Missouri. On September 6, 1978, the Commission issued an Order dismissing the case for want of prosecution because Applicant had failed to provide a revised feasibility study. The matter was reinstated by motion filed by Applicant and on June 20, 1979, the Commission issued its Report and Order granting the authority requested. Ordered: 4 thereof directed Applicant to file within forty (30) days after the effective date of the Report and Order, its tariffs, rules and regulations for operation for the Commission's approval. On August 2, 1979, Applicant submitted its original tariffs in accordance with the Commission's Report and Order. The proposed tariffs bore a requested effective date of September 4, 1979. On August 21, 1979, the Public Council filed with the Commission a statement of position challenging rules three (J) and three (K) of the proposed tariffs. On August 31, 1979, the Commission suspended the proposed tariffs for a period of one hundred twenty (120) days beyond September 4, 1979, the requested effective date to January 2, 1980, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.

Due to a computer failure, the Commission allowed the proposed tariffs to go into effect by operation of law on January 2, 1980. The Commission Staff

contacted Applicant in regard to this error and on January 11, 1980, Applicant resubmitted tariffs that had deleted the objectionable portions. Said revised tariffs filed on January 11, 1980, bore an effective date of February 11, 1980. On February 8, 1980, the Commission allowed the revised tariffs to go into effect without suspension.

The Commission concludes that there are no further issues to be resolved in this case and as such it should be closed at this time.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That Case No. SA-77-167 filed with the Commission on March 21, 1977, be, and it is, hereby closed.

ORDERED: 2. That this Order shall become effective on the 26th day of February, 1980.
