By the authority vested in the Missouri Public Service Commission under section 386.410, RSMo 2000, the commission amends a rule as follows:

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

4 CSR 240-2.080 Pleadings, Filing, and Service is amended.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 15, 2001 (26 MoReg 1965-1966). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed amendment, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed amendment becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: One comment was received requesting changes to the service requirement.

COMMENT: One comment from the Commission's Staff was received which suggested further revision to the rule by amending sections (8) and (18). The commentor stated that the rule should be further amended to require an additional copy to be filed with the Commission which would be routed to the Commission's General Counsel's Office. The commentor proposes this copy replace the usual service copy required by section (10) of the rule. The commentor stated that this will avoid the delay that occurs when service is made by regular mail. The commentor also suggested that the Commission take a more comprehensive review of the filing rule and require that parties filing by non-electronic means be required to "contemporaneously serve represented parties on the date of filing with the Commission."

RESPONSE: The Commission disagrees with the commentor that the suggested change is appropriate at this time. The major purpose of these proposed amendments is to allow parties to decrease the number of paper copies they must file with the Commission by providing for electronic filing and service methods. The Commission finds, therefore, that any amendment changing the service requirements, such as requiring simultaneous service on the parties with filing at the Commission, should only be implemented after notice and an opportunity for comments on that issue. The Commission will consider making further amendments to the rule in a separate rulemaking. The amendments as proposed were intended to only address methods for electronic service that will ultimately increase the speed with which the commentor receives service for many pleadings. Therefore, the Commission finds that the rule is appropriate as proposed and no changes are necessary.

The Commission finds, therefore, that any amendment changing the service requirements, such as requiring simultaneous service on the parties with filing at the Commission, should only be implemented after notice and an opportunity for comments on that issue. The amendments as proposed were intended to only address methods for electronic service that will ultimately increase the speed with which the commentor receives service for many pleadings.
