STAFF REPORT CLASS COST-OF-SERVICE and RATE DESIGN

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I. Background

The company currently has five (5) customers. Four (4) of the customers currently take service under the terms of the Company's 'Steam Service' rate. The fifth customer, Ag Processing, Inc. (AGP), is served under the terms of a contract negotiated between KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company ("Company" or "GMO") and AGP. The Company also has a 'Supplemental Steam Service' rate, but there are no customers taking service on this tariff.

GMO's current rate structure for steam service is shown in the table below.

When determining the revenue requirement, AGP's revenues were calculated using the tariffed rates of the Steam Service class. As discussed on pp. 55-56 of the Staff Report on Cost-of-Service filed on February 13, 2009, this is the Commission-approved approach resulting from earlier Stipulation and Agreements, and is not an issue in this case.

II. Class Cost of Service

The Staff did not perform a class cost-of-service study in this case. There is only one tariffed rate for the Company's current steam customers, and all of GMO's steam customers are either taking service under the steam service tariff or are treated as if they are for purposes of ratemaking; therefore, the Staff did not perform a class cost-of-service study.

III. **Quarterly Cost Adjustment ("QCA")**

GMO has proposed a modification to its current fuel adjustment rider, known as the

QCA. Staff has no proposals to change the Company's current fuel adjustment rider,

known as the QCA, but is interested in participating in discussions among the parties

regarding the QCA. The Staff addresses the QCA in the Cost of Service Report's Fuel

Adjustment Rider Section.

III. **Standby or Supplemental Service Rate**

No customer currently takes service under the "Standby or Supplemental Service"

rate schedule. Therefore, Staff would not oppose eliminating this rate schedule.

IV. Recommendation

Staff recommends that all components of the Steam Service rates be increased by a

uniform percentage, equal to the percentage increase in revenues resulting from the order

in this case. Using this method will result in rates that collect the Company's revenue

requirement, but keep each customer's relative revenue contribution the same as under

the current rates.
