In the Matter of the Petition of the North American Numbering Plan Administrator, on Behalf of the Missouri Telecommunications Industry, for Approval of NPA Relief Plan for the 314 and 816 Area Codes

Dear Mr. Roberts:

NeuStar, Inc., in its role as the North American Numbering Plan Administrator ("NANPA") and acting on behalf of the Missouri telecommunications industry ("Industry") and pursuant to the October 24, 2000 Report and Order ("Order") of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") in the above-referenced proceeding, submits an original and eight copies of the Industry's numbering plan area ("NPA") relief implementation plan and schedule for NPA relief in the 816 NPA.²

¹ The Industry is composed of current and prospective telecommunications carriers operating in or considering operations within the 816 area code of the state of Missouri.

² As the neutral third party administrator, NANPA has no independent view regarding the Industry's decisions.

In the Order, the Commission directed the Industry to implement an all services distributed overlay over the existing 816 area code. The Order also required the Industry to submit to the Commission, within sixty days of the release of the Order, its schedule for implementing the overlay NPA.

On November 30, 2000, by conference call, NANPA facilitated a meeting of the Industry to help establish the implementation plan and schedule for the 816 NPA.³ During the meeting, the Industry reached consensus to adopt a timetable for implementing NPA relief, establish dialing patterns and other implementation elements for the 816 relief NPA. The following chart sets forth the Industry's implementation schedule:

During the November 30 meeting, the Industry reached consensus to adopt the following dialing plan:

- All local calls within and between the 816 and the new NPA will require 10-digit dialing.
- All toll calls within and between the 816 and the new NPA will require 1+10 digit dialing.

The Industry reached consensus to create subcommittees to address outstanding customer education and technical implementation issues. Southwestern Bell volunteered to provide a test number for the purpose of implementing the new relief NPA.

MISSOURI - 816 NPA INITIAL IMPLEMENTATION MEETING CONFERENCE CALL

NOVEMBER 30, 2000

WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

Mr. Frank Colaco, NeuStar, Inc., North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA) NPA Relief Planner opened the meeting with introductions, a review of the agenda and the objectives of the meeting. A list of attendees can be found in Attachment 1.

Mr. Colaco also reviewed the consensus process definition with the participants and emphasized silence was consensus.

REVIEW OF CURRENT 816 NPA STATUS AND NXX CODE ASSIGNMENT

Mr. Joseph Rano, Sr. Code Administrator, provided the following code assignment history over the last six months for the 816 NPA:

DISCUSS APPROVED RELIEF PLAN

Mr. Colaco reviewed the plan approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission (PSC), which ordered the 816 NPA to receive an all services distributed overlay. He also noted that the Order required that an implementation schedule be filed with the MPSC no later than 60 days following the effective date of the order, or December 23, 2000.

ESTABLISH IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

A proposal was made, and consensus was reached to adopt the following schedule for implementation of the 816 relief plan:

ESTABLISH DIALING PLAN

A proposal was made and consensus was reached to adopt the following dialing plan between the 816 and the new NPA:

- All local calls within and between 816 and NEW NPA will require 10-digit dialing.
- All toll calls within and between 816 and NEW NPA will require 1+10 digit dialing.

The Industry respectfully requests that the Missouri Public Service Commission consider allowing the above referenced dialing plan for the New NPA.

Due to an oversight, the discussion of the dialing plan was inadvertently omitted from the agenda of the implementation meeting that was held on November 30, 2000. During the conference call held December 18 to review and approve these minutes, consensus was reached to adopt the aforementioned dialing plan between the 816 and the new relief NPA.

TEST NUMBER

Southwestern Bell volunteered to provide a test number for the purpose of implementing the new NPA. The actual number, as well as its dates of availability will be published in the Planning Letter for this NPA implementation.

DUPLICATE CODES

CO Code Administration indicated that there were no issues related to Duplicate Codes at this time. Cut off date for the service providers to request duplicate codes will be December 1, 2000.

ESTABLISH SUBCOMMITTEES

Technical Subcommittee: Jack Johnson (Sprint PCS) and Celine McArthur (Teligent) both volunteered to participate, but did not wish to chair the subcommittee.

Customer Education Subcommittee: Jennifer Bosshardt [jennifer.bosshardt@mail.sprint.com] (Sprint) agreed to co-chair the Customer Education Subcommittee. Shannon Harrington (SBC) agreed to participate in the subcommittee.

Industry Subcommittee: It was agreed that an Industry Subcommittee would be formed. There are no co-chairs or Industry participants identified at this time.

FILE IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

Pursuant to the requirement of the MPSC Order, the Implementation Plan, together with final approved minutes of this call will be filed with the Commission on or before December 22, 2000.
