On October 30, 2020, the Staff of the Public Service Commission filed a pleading advising the Commission to cancel the certificate of service authority to provide private payphone services of Embarq Payphone Services, Inc., d/b/a CenturyLink Public Communications, Inc. at that company's request. The Commission granted certificate of service authority to that company's predecessor, Sprint Payphone Service, on February 3, 1998, in File No. TA-98-246.

The Commission need not hold a hearing, if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing.¹ Therefore, if no request for a hearing or objection to Staff's motion is received, the Commission may cancel the certificate based on Staff's recommendation and the company's request.

The Commission finds that proper persons shall be allowed 10 days from the issuance of this order to file a motion for hearing.
